A few years ago, I started the Stanford Project Respect initiative to study health care communication and foster mutually respectful interactions between health professionals and their patients. Through this project, my colleagues and I recently conducted research in four medical schools across the country, the results of which were just published in the journal Academic Medicine. Using professional actors, we re-enacted 34 real-life microaggression scenarios paired with comparable "non-toxic" versions of these situations, to serve as controls. The 68 videos were shown in random order to medical faculty members from the four universities, who were asked to rate each scenario on the frequency of occurrence in real life.
